National Apprenticeship Week

This is a national event running from 7th to 13th February which aims to highlight the work being done by employers and apprentices.

So what is an Apprenticeship? An Apprenticeship combines practical training in a job with study.

Apprenticeships take 1 to 5 years to complete depending on their level.

As an apprentice you will -

- Be an employee earning a wage and getting holiday pay
- Work alongside experienced staff
- Get time for training and study related to your role (at least 20% of your normal working hours)

Apprenticeships have equivalent educational levels.

	Level	Equivalent educational level
Intermediate	2	GCSE
Advanced	3	Alevel
Higher	4,5,6 and 7	Foundation degree and above
Degree	6 and 7	Bachelor's or master's degree
